P.A.T. VAN PROGRAM UPDATE

Many of you know about, and some have volunteered to help with, our partnership with the Nodaway County Ambulance District to provide rides home from the hospital for elderly people who have no one else to take them, "after hours" (6:00 PM to 6:00 AM Monday-Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday) using the P.A.T. van. We are providing transportation for those who would otherwise need to call an ambulance to take them home. An ambulance ride costs \$250, and we are providing them the service for \$40 (and even less than that due to money provided by the Senior Center). Plus, in terms of public safety, tying up an ambulance to make a non-emergency run was endangering the lives of all Nodaway County citizens in need of emergency services.

In 2016 we provided 57 transports, which averages out to just over 1 run per week. For these runs, our council earned over \$2,100. But just as important, it saved money for all of us in taxes as Medicare patients did not have to call an ambulance in order to get home.

Right now a little more than 1/3 of our council members have volunteered to help. If you are not signed up yet, please consider doing so today! We always work in teams of 2 on runs, and we are helping out our community.



CHARITY

- Conception Abbey - \$100 for their annual Lenten Appeal.
- \$300 to an appeal made by Conception Abbey for a Retirement Fund to care for elderly Monks.
- R I B - (approximately) \$1,400 to meet our 100% quota - R I B stands for Religious Information Bureau and \$7.50 of your dues goes to fund this program which provides information for non-Catholics wanting to learn more about our Faith, and provides continuing education courses for Catholics interested in deepening or refreshing their understanding of our Faith. - American Wheelchair Mission - \$150 which will purchase one wheelchair for a person in need. In all likelihood it will go to someone in a developing country, where one wheelchair is a life-changing gift to the recipient, but also for the 10 people (on average) it takes to care for them now.
- We purchased, prepared, and served lunch for the Special Olympics athletes who participated in the basketball tournament at Bearcat Arena on January 29. (See pictures on Page 3).
- \$250 to the family of a seminarian at Conception whose mother passed away from cancer, leaving a husband and 5 children at home.
- \$300 to support a retreat sponsored by the Newman Center.
- Thank you to everyone who has brought canned goods to our meetings. Rick Smail has been taking them to the Maryville Food Pantry.
- And once again, many thanks to Harry Schieber for transporting the canned goods collected at church in January - March to the Maryville Food Pantry.

- Jan. 28 - Youth Basketball Tournament - Thanks again to the planning and coordination by chairman Rick Smail, our Youth basketball tournament was once again a great success! Once again, several members stepped forward and agreed to volunteer to referee games so we didn't have to pay officials. After expenses, we made around \$1,700 in profit. DID YOU KNOW...

Do you realize the impact you have in being a Missouri Knights of Columbus member?

In 2015-2016 Missouri Knights of Columbus...

...through its Meet Life program continued to save the lives of the unborn. This program has placed 39 ultrasound machines across the state and in 2015 helped to save the lives of 4,709 babies whose mothers were considering abortion.

...through its Religious Information Bureau, provided courses on the Catholic faith which over 11,500 people world-wide enrolled in.

...gave over \$108,000 in financial support to 166 seminarians and 2 postulants in Missouri.

...gave \$50,000 in grants to Catholic Schools and PSRs. These were given in terms of \$500 and \$1,000 grants, involving over 84 different entities.
