# PARISH MISSION

One of the most important things we have ever done as a Knights council recently occurred as we sponsored a Parish Mission on two consecutive evenings - Monday and Tuesday, September 12-13. Not only were there four incredible speakers, but there were also numerous religious relics on hand for people to venerate (photos of a small portion of the relics available are on Page 3), There were also various religious books, pamphlets, handouts, CDs, rosaries, etc. which were either available for a small charge or given away for free. And they also had many, many framed religious pictures which were available at no charge. (Their goal is to have as many religious pictures in people's homes as possible.)

I should also note that we partnered with the Cathedral of St. Joseph on this so on Monday two of the speakers were in Maryville while the other two were in St. Joseph, and then they switched for Tuesday.

Both evenings began with Mass and then there were two presentations. Fr. Albert was also available for those who wished to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. In between the presenters, attendees had the opportunity to view the relics and gather articles to take home.

As an added benefit, one of the presenters stayed one extra day and on Wednesday did a separate presentation specifically geared for the students at St. Gregory's. We have heard many reports on how excited the students were with their experience.

The goal of the mission was to "Ignite a Fire" in peoples' hearts for the love that Christ and Mary have for us all, and based upon the feedback from those in attendance, that goal was met! Attendees were given several examples on how the Eucharist is TRULY the body and blood of Christ, and not just a ritual representation, and that Adoration is one of the best ways for us to become closer with Christ.

As noted previously, the Knights\* were the ones who sponsored this Mission, but additional thanks and recognition need to go to Rick & Shelia Smail, and Carla Spire and Dorothy Schafer for providing a meal for the presenters and their "support staff" on both evenings. Other Knights who need to be recognized are Grand Knight Roger Laughlin for arranging this, but for also providing lodging at his house. Plus Don Crane provided one presenter with a ride to KCI for his flight. We would also like to thank the Drury Inn in St. Joseph for providing complementary rooms for the speakers as well.

There is a distinct possibility that one of the presenters will be asked to come back to do another presentation in the near future, so we will need to wait and see if that happens. But if it does, I would STRONGLY encourage you, your spouse, and your children to attend. Especially any adult children you have which may have fallen away from the Catholic Faith.

## COUNCIL ACTIVITIES SURVEY

In middle August, we send out a survey asking council members what they thought about the number of activities we currently do. We received 43 replies, and the results break down as follows:

81.4% of the respondents thought we had a good number and mix of activities, and we should keep them all.

11.6% thought we should keep doing everything we are doing, but add more.

7% thought we should quit doing certain activities and add different ones.

0% replied that we should quit certain activities, and not add others.

Based upon this and some comments we received, we are going to do the following:

- Rethink who will be the beneficiaries of our 2 benefit Fish Fries.
- Even though it was quite popular, we will not be doing a Tenderloin fundraiser this fraternal year. This may be something we do next Fall.

## OVERTURN OF ROE VS. WADE

We can most certainly rejoice over the recent Supreme Court ruling which overturned Roe vs. Wade, and placed abortion policy back at the state level. As I'm sure you know, Missouri has an abortion policy which went into effect almost immediately following the court ruling. But what impact does this have on us as Knights?

First of all, only Missouri's neighboring states of Arkansas and Oklahoma have abortion policies in place. Women facing unplanned pregnancies can certainly continue to get an abortion by traveling across a state line. That is why the Missouri Knights are continuing our efforts to change the culture from one of "Choice" (a culture of death) to a culture of "Life." The State council will continue on with the "Meet Life" program, where women get to "meet" their baby, through an ultrasound.

Many people ask what we are doing to support mothers who end up choosing Life. At the Supreme Convention, the Supreme Council introduced a program called ASAP -Aid and Support After Pregnancy. This program encourages councils to support Pregnancy Resource Centers and Maternity Homes in their area. For each \$500 a council provides to a Center, Supreme will donate \$100 to that Center. If a Council gives \$1,000, Supreme will donate \$200. What a fantastic way to show that we as Knights are there to support Life.
