FAITH FORMATION

Last summer we send out a survey to members asking them what they would like to see us do as a council, and one area listed was "Faith Formation." We have hosted a weekly Bible Study for several years, and all people (not just Knights) are invited to attend so we tried to come up with other things we thought might be of interest. Fr. Albert wanted to see the movie "Fr. Stu" so on December 28 we scheduled a viewing. For those who do not know, Fr. Stu is based upon the true story of Fr. Stuart Long, who turned from being a lifelong troublemaker to becoming a Priest. On March 5 we showed the movie "Mother Teresa: No Greater Love." This is the award winning docudrama produced by the Knights of Columbus. While the people that attended both of these films were very happy that we showed them, there was not an overabundance of people in attendance. FISH FRIES

As this is being written, we have completed 2 of our 4 scheduled Fish Fries, and they have been VERY successful. We estimate that we served almost 700 meals at the first one, and over 700 at the second one, taking into account our Dine In / Take Out / and Drive Thru options. In fact we ran out of fish at both, even though we increased the amount we fixed at our second one We will provide complete details and pictures in our Summer

newsletter, but I did I want to show the new 3-basket deep fryer we purchased to supplement what we are cooking in our old 6-basket one. If it wasn't for adding this additional fryer, there is no way we could have kept up with demand!



CHARITY

- \$250 to go to the Nodaway County DARE. program
- \$250 to the benefit for Brother Knight Todd Rickabaugh
- \$400 (approx.) for the food needed to feed Special Olympics Missouri Athletes, Coaches and Volunteers at their Regional Basketball Tournament which was held at Bearcat Arena. (Pictures on Page 3)
- \$450 (enough to sponsor 3 St. Gregory's Confirmation students) to go on a retreat at Conception Abbey next August
- \$300 (enough to purchase 2 wheelchairs) was donated to the American Wheelchair Mission
- R I B (approximately) \$1,300 to meet our 100% quota - R I B stands for Religious Information Bureau and \$7.50 of your dues goes to fund this program. This money is then turned over to each Diocese for a variety of Faith Enrichment programs.
- \$60 to help support the Raffle being put on by the Kansas City - St. Joseph KofC Chapter. The money raised helps to support the many activities done by the Chapter.
- Thank you to all members who helped with or supported our Ladies Auxiliary Mardi Gras Brunch.

PATVAN

A big "Thank you" to everyone who volunteers to help with the PATVan. Through your help, we made a total of 61 runs in 2022 which earned \$2,540 for our council! That is one reason we were able to increase our charitable donations. If you do not currently volunteer to help out by taking a PATVan shift (about 3-4 times per year) please consider doing so. You will be placed with a partner, so you do not need to solo, and training will be provided.

COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

Our council has been providing a \$500 scholarship to a graduating HS Senior who attends St. Gregory's, St. Benedict's (Burlington Junction) or St. Paul's (Tarkio) since 2005. At a meeting earlier this year, the council voted to increase our scholarship total to \$750. We all know the cost of higher education increases each year, and we hope that by increasing our award it will help out our winner even that much more. If you know a HS senior who is eligible, make sure you let them know and encourage them to apply. Applications must be postmarked by March 31.

STATE CONVENTION

Our council will be well represented with four members attending this year's State Convention, which will be held April 21-23 in Columbia. Phil Smail and Tom Spire were elected as delegates to represent our council. Ron Mathias will be in attendance in his role as the Leadership Development Chairman.



Mike Grudzinski will be there in his role as the Immediate Past State Deputy. This is a new beginning for the State Convention as it will not be held at the Capitol Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City for the first time in about 30 years.

On June 17 the State Council will be hosting a Knights Game at the K as the Royals will be taking on the Los Angeles Angels. Tickets are \$40, but that also includes a pre-game tailgate (burgers, brats, hot dogs, beans, chips, desserts and water) PLUS \$5.00 from each ticket will go to Special Olympics Missouri. This is less than 1/2 of the regular cost of \$35 if you purchase your parking pass on site.


