FISH FRY AND TENDERLOIN BENEFITS

Due to COVID, we had to cancel our last 2 Fish Fries in 2020. In 2021, we only had a drive-thru option. In 2022, we were not sure how many people would feel comfortable in dining in, so we kept our drive-thru option but also gave people the opportunity to once again eat together, and most importantly, to spend time socializing as a community. Our drive-thru option was still *very* popular as we had quite a few people go through, but each time our dine-in crowd grew larger and larger. In fact with our drive-thru and dine-in options, we served more people and made more money than we ever had done before! After expenses, here is how we turned out:

- FF #1 \$1,949 Profit (for our Council)
- FF #2 \$2,337 Profit for "Meet Life Phase 2"
- FF #3 \$1,899 Profit (for our Council)
- FF #4 \$2,496 Profit for Camp Quality NW Missouri. We also did a Pork Tenderloin Meal to benefit "The Source" Pregnancy Resource Center in Maryville. While not quite as successful as our Fish Fries, we were still able to donate our profits of \$1,529 to them. THANK YOU to everyone who helped to make these fundraisers so successful.

CHARITY

- \$1,305 to fulfill our 100% quota for the RIB (Religious Information Bureau) program
- \$1,203 to Lettuce Dream. This money comes from the additional assessment included on dues statements. Thank you for those who donated!
- \$1,000 to help renovate Lou & Rene Schreck's house so their son Joe can rehabilitate following an accident.
- \$200 to the St. Gregory's Kitchen for its use for our Fish Fries
- \$100 to the Heart of America Tractor Cruise
- \$75 to the Nodaway News Leader for an ad related to an article on charitable organizations in the county.\$
- \$750* to our scholarship winner Maggie Graham (daughter of Matt & April Graham) who will be attending Northwest Missouri State in the Fall. (*We began offering a \$500 scholarship to a graduating HS student in 2005, and this year we raised our amount to \$750.)
