FISH FRIES

As of this writing, we have just completed our final Fish Fry. The money amounts listed below are the *proceeds* received at each event. Once we have finalized our total expenses, we will divide that number by 4 and subtract that amount from the total we received to determine our Profits.

- Fish Fry # 1 (For our Council) \$5,795.25 Dine In = \$3,673.25; Drive Through = \$2,122.00
- Fish Fry # 2 (For The Source) \$6,402.00 Dine In = \$3,975.00; Drive Through = \$2,427.00
- Fish Fry # 3 (For our Council) \$5,882.00
 Dine In = \$3,269.00; Drive Through = \$2,613.00
- Fish Fry # 4 (For Nodaway County Special Olympics) \$8,347.00

Dine In = \$6,026.00; Drive Through = \$2,321.00

At our March meeting we voted to use whatever profits we receive for our council fish fries to pay for the new Ice Maker which was installed in the school cafeteria. The approximate cost for the ice maker was \$3,000.

I would like to take an opportunity to recognize members who worked at EVERY Fish Fry, starting with Rick Smail, Roger Laughlin, Mark Parra and Phil Smail who came in early to get things set up. We also had a crew who helped with breading the fish EVERY TIME: Paul Heflin, Larry Auffert and Warren McConkey. There were 2 Knights who volunteered to work the Serving Line for EVERY event and that was Art Filips and Cody Piveral. Manning the Dessert table for EVERY Fish Fry was John Meyers, Mike Shipps and Mark Schieber. Making himself available to run the Dishwasher for EVERY Fish Fry was Deacon Mike Casteel. Helping Tom Spire with the Clean Up crew for EVERY event was Ron Spire and Don Crane.

If you didn't help out with any Fish Fries this year, I would invite you to do so next year. Our first two principles are Charity and Unity. Working at a Fish Fry is doing your pledge of Charity, but also building Unity with your Brother Knights.

CHARITY

- As noted in the first column, we will be donating (approximately) \$3,000 to St. Gregory's to pay for the Ice Machine for the School Cafeteria. Those who have been members for awhile may remember that we purchased the ice machine which was just replaced.
- \$300 (enough to purchase 2 wheelchairs) was donated to the American Wheelchair Mission
- R I B (approximately) \$1,300 to meet our 100% quota R I B stands for Religious Information Bureau and \$7.50 of your dues goes to fund this program. This money is then turned over to each Diocese for a variety of Faith Enrichment programs.
- \$100 to the Maryville Fire Department to purchase pamphlets for area youth.
- Our council served donuts after the 8:00 AM Mass on March 10.
- Thank you to all members who helped with or supported our Ladies Auxiliary Mardi Gras Brunch.

In terms of Charity, we would like to recognize the Maryville Elks Lodge. One of the refrigerators we use to store Fish Fry supplies quit working. We put out a plea to see if anyone had a refrigerator they would donate to us. If no one had one, we were going to be forced to purchase one. However, the Elks stepped forward and donated one of theirs. That is what makes fraternal societies so great. We not only help people in need, but we also look out for one another. Thanks again Elks!

STATE CONVENTION

PATVAN

A big "Thank you" to everyone who volunteers to help with the PATVan. Through your help, we made a total of 71 runs in 2023 which earned \$2,840 for our council! If you do not currently volunteer to help out by taking a PATVan shift (about 3-4 times per year) please consider doing so. You will be placed with a partner, so you do not need to solo, and training will be provided.

DECLINE TO SIGN

Throughout the state, abortion supporters are actively collecting signatures for an initiative petition to insert abortion into the Missouri Constitution on the fall 2024 ballot. If successful, this extreme initiative petition would revoke the legal protections that currently safeguard



preborn children and mothers in the state. Missouri Right to Life has released the following 10 reasons you should "Decline to Sign."

- 1. Parental Consent Laws will be eliminated.
- Partial-birth / Late-term abortions on demand will be considered a "right."
- 3. Abortions available all 9 months of pregnancy.- Based upon "physical or mental health" reasons.
- 4. Health & Safety standard for abortion clinics will be eliminated. If this passes, anyone could provide an abortion without a healthcare license.
- Missouri's 52+ Pro-Life laws will be eliminated.- A constitutional amendment overrides any laws which have been passed.
- Women lose the ability to sue for malpractice for anything that might happen during an abortion procedure.
- 7. Pregnancy Resource Centers (like The Source in Maryville) will be forced to refer women for abortions.
- 8. Ultrasounds eliminated. Abortion clinics will no longer be forced to offer or show a mother an ultrasound of her baby.
- 9. Significant loss in revenue to Missouri state revenues.
- Taxpayer-funded abortions will become a "right" and lawmakers will be forced to appropriate funds to abortion providers.
